

DID YOU KNOW...

70% of all 15-17 year-olds who have ever gone online have accidentally stumbled across pornography online, 23 percent "very" or "somewhat" often. (Kaiser Family Foundation study, 2001)

1 in 5 children ages 10-17 have received a sexual solicitation over the Internet. (The Web's Dark Secret; Newsweek, 19 March, 2001)

43% of children said they do not have rules about Internet use in their homes. (Time/CNN Poll, 2000)

74% of commercial pornography sites display free porn images on the homepage. (Child-Proofing on the World Wide Web: A Survey of Adult Webservers, 2001, Jurimetrics (abstract).)

9 of 10 kids aged 8-16 have viewed pornography on the Internet, often in the process of doing homework. (London School of Economics January 2002)

Safe Internet Use

We are the first generation of "Internet Parents"

The Internet provides our children with an invaluable resource for learning, but it has introduced an entirely new set of concerns into our homes.

We as parents need to become Internet Savvy. By this I mean that we develop a basic understanding of what's on the Internet and how children use it. We are the first generation of Internet parents, so it's all new to everyone.

Don't be intimidated if you haven't done much on the Web except e-mailing or shopping—anyone can learn about how the Internet works. And don't be afraid to admit to your children that they are probably more Net savvy than you. What's most

important is to understand the Internet within the context of your children's own experiences.



Protecting our most

Begin by visiting the sites they visit, just as you'd want to know where they go in the real world.

Use an Internet filtering tool. Internet filters are programs that "preview" text before it is sent to your computer. If the filter encounters an objectionable site, the computer

user will be notified that the site is not appropriate.

Create some house rules for how much time children can spend online.

Keep the computer out of your child's bedroom. Instead, set it up in an area that's used by the entire family.

Know who your children talk to and write to online, whether through an instant message, e-mail, or chat-room conversation.

Proper use of the Internet in our homes can bless our families lives.

Terminology

Instant Messaging

a computer application which allows for communications in real time, a live chat and email service. Programs include AIM, Yahoo, Windows Live Messenger and Skype.

E-Mail

a system for sending messages from one individual to another via telecommunications links between computers or terminals.

Chat-room

a site on a computer network where online conversations are held in real time by a number of users.

Forum

a system that enables users to send or read electronic messages, files, and other data that are of general interest and addressed to no particular person.

Myspace.com

a social networking website offering an interactive, user-submitted network of friends, personal profiles, blogs, groups, photos, music, and videos and is similar in format to BeBo, hi5.com and Yahoo! 360.

Internet Filter

software which determines what content will be available on a particular machine or network; the motive is often to prevent persons from viewing content which the computer's

owner(s) or other authorities may consider objectionable.

Anti-Virus

software which attempts to identify, thwart and eliminate computer viruses and other malicious software (malware).

Firewall

an integrated collection of security measures designed to prevent unauthorized electronic access to a networked computer system.

Blog

an online diary; published on a Web page

Podcast

a Web-based audio broadcast over the Internet.
